

# FOOD FOR THOUGHT

#### AN INVITATION TO SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINES

Have you ever considered the only thing you can really control is . . . . YOU!

Think about it, we can't control anyone else, we can't control the past or the future, but what I can control (and I use that term loosely) is what I do at this very moment in time. That may sound negative, but that's really a positive.

For 18 weeks I spoke about spiritual disciplines. As I was thinking about the past and the future, I didn't want them to be forgotten. The Spiritual disciplines are about our seeking to grow in who Christ has called us to be. When we take time to practice Christian spiritual activities, even in the midst of our everyday lives, these behaviors become simply a way of placing my will and my life before God as a living sacrifice.

Dallas Willard often said that the outcome of our spiritual activities far exceeds what we put into them. That leads me to think that the disciplines are really about receiving grace from God. God takes offering of time and action and uses it to transform us into people God has called us to be.

We grow in the Fruits of the Spirit . . . love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22).

Certainly spiritual activities (disciplines) — things like prayer, study, giving, worship, celebration, and more become part of our daily living. We become more and more transformed into the image of Jesus Christ. Eventually, we become people who can respond to life as Jesus.

The disciplines are not about doing something for God, or earning righteousness from God. We engage in the disciplines in response to God's love.

The disciplines are an invitation, not an obligation. Listen to the Spirit. What are you being led into? Where would God like to meet you today and where can you meet God?

Begin where you are according to who you are. What's most important is to start. Let's continue this journey as we grow closer to Christ together. Today, you can control how you grow closer to Christ.
