Pastor Michael's Thoughts

We're in week 4 of the NFL season, and for all practical purposes the season is already over for my Chicago Bears. They are in a battle for being the worst team in the NFL for the second year in a row. They have been outscored in their 3 games by an average of 20 points. Nobody has been outscored by more. This week they get to play another 0-3 team. I still don't give them much hope.

Why am I lamenting about football? Because it leads me to a topic to talk about. As people are calling for the quarterback to be benched, the coaches to be fired, can you imagine reading this in the news, or your kids overhearing how terrible their parent is? How distressing and upsetting. Whether they are good or bad players and coaches isn't the point. They are people.

That's where they and we as well, need to surround ourselves with the Barnabas' of the world. Barnabas was a New Testament believer in Jesus. He wasn't an apostle, he wasn't a disciple. He was just an ordinary guy who came to a saving faith in Jesus.

The cool thing about Barnabas is that his name means "Son of Encouragement." That

was Barnabas, the ultimate encourager. When nobody wanted to meet with Paul, Barnabas walked alongside of him.

The "Encouragement" in his nickname literally means "called alongside." That's the Greek word that paints the picture of someone throwing their arms around you and giving you a big ol' bearhug of encouragement.

When persecution scattered the Jerusalem believers, those who landed in Antioch, 300 miles to the north, shared the gospel with other Jews as well as with Greeks. Luke tells us "The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord" (Acts 11:21). So, Barnabas was dispatched to pastor that infant flock because nothing would be more important than a person who was born to encourage God's people.

When he arrived and saw what the grace of God had done, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. (Acts 11:23)

Imagine Barnabas's arrival: big smile, gentle eyes, hearty laugh, hugs. As he heard one salvation story after another he rejoiced, and his joy was infectious. That's part of the encourager's gift. He looked into the faces of those Greek believers who didn't know Genesis from Jonah, how marriage came to be, or what the Ten Commandments are, and yet here they were, alive with the Holy Spirit!

The Bible is filled with stories of encouragers. How can you be one as well? How can you walk alongside someone and offer words of encouragement? I've always believed, 'if you don't have something good to say, don't say anything.' Just keep it zipped. Sometimes, yes, you need to hold someone accountable, but can you do that with love and grace and gentleness, so that they know in the end they are loved. Then as you finish, offer a word of encouragement. Take a lesson from Barnabas and demonstrate encouragement.

Three verses to guide you are - - - -

1 Thessalonians 5:11 - Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

Hebrews 10:24-25 - And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Ephesians 4:29 ESV - Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

From John Ortberg's "All The Places To Go... How Will You Know?"

A common myth about God and doors and the truth that lies behind them...

"If I can't tell which door to choose, either God is doing something wrong or I am"

I have learned this the hard way. Rarely when I have faced one of the "big door" decisions has the choice been simple for me. When I was trying to choose a vocation, I can remember praying for hours, being frustrated to the point of tears. "God, just tell me what to do, and I'll do it. I don't even care what it is. I just want to know."

Crickets.

I did not realize for many years that what I was looking for wasn't so much "God's will for my life." What I was really looking for was a way to be relieved of the anxiety that comes with taking responsibility for making a difficult decision.

God is a door opener, but he is not a celestial enabler. He doesn't even need the twelve steps - who would he turn his will over to?

This is foundational for understanding the notion of open doors correctly: God's primary will for you is the person you become.

The apostle Paul says that God "chose us in (Christ) before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight" (Ephesians 1:4). In other words, God's basic will for your life is not what you do or where you live or whether you marry or how much you make; it's who you become. God's primary will for your life is that you become a person of excellent character, wholesome liveliness, and divine love. That's what words like *godly* and *holy* (which too often become religious clichés) point to.
